# bragging writes: *school block clock*

## you'll need

### Surface & Embellishments

- Clock, 9"x9".
- Card Stock (Prism Papers): Classic Blue; Iced Yellow; Georgia Pacific White.

### Tools & Supplies

- Stamps (Cornish Heritage Farms): Scrapblocks™ Writing Paper; Pin Dot; Making the Grade.
- Ink Pads (Tsukineko): StazOn: Azure; Adirondack: Citrus, Watermelon; Sunset Orange; Sail Boat Blue.
- Copic Markers.
- Wizard Die Cutting and Embossing System (Spellbinders).
- Nestabilities Dies (Spellbinders): Classic Circle; Scallop.
- Dimensional foam adhesive.

## what to do

(Note: Scrapblocks are 6"x6" and fit perfectly on a 12"x12" card stock sheet.)

- 1 Remove clock mechanism. Set aside.
- 2 Cut four ½-wide strips from Classic Blue card stock to same length as block. Glue to edges of block.
- 3 Use Azure ink to stamp Writing Paper four times on Iced Yellow card stock, alternating direction and keeping it square.
- 4 Place clock in center of stamped card stock, aligning mechanism hole and four corners where writing papers meet. Trace around block and cut ¼" inside traced line.
- 5 Use die cutting system to cut largest scalloped circle from Georgia Pacific White card stock. Use Citrus ink to stamp Pin Dot on scalloped circle; adhere to center of Writing Paper.

- 6 Line up on block to find hole in both layers and trim excess. Use piercing tool to poke around circle and trim excess. (Note: Clock mechanism must fit through hole with washers and nuts fitting correctly.) Glue block to base.
- 7 Use Watermelon ink to stamp schoolhouse; Sail Boat Blue ink to stamp books; Citrus ink to stamp apple; Sunset Orange ink to stamp worm. Use Watermelon ink to stamp apples for remaining numbers. Cut out images. Cut or punch apples. Use dimensional adhesive to adhere images at 12, 3, 6 and 9 o'clock. Glue apples approximately 1" from scalloped edge in number places.
- 8 Reinstall clock mechanism.
